MESSAGING

PRICES CONTINUE TO SOAR

- As the cost of living continues to rise and real wages continue to fall, Americans are struggling to keep up. This is the cost of Democrats' recklessness.
- December's Consumer Price Index soared by <u>6.5%</u> compared to last year, remaining excessively high.
 - Fuel oil is up 41.5%;
 - Transportation is up 14.6%;
 - Electricity is up 14.3%;
 - Food at home is up 11.8%;
 - Food away from home is up 8.3%
 - Shelter is up 7.5%;
 - New cars are up 5.9%;
 - Medical care is up 4.1%.
- Real average hourly earnings fell <u>1.7%</u> since last year, marking the <u>21st</u> month in a row under Biden in which inflation has outpaced wages.
- Real wages have fallen every month since Biden and Democrats passed their wasteful \$1.9 trillion "stimulus."
- Already Republicans are taking steps to address this.
 - This week, the new House Republican majority <u>voted</u> to <u>repeal</u> <u>funding for Biden's 87,000 IRS agents</u> and to block efforts to increase audits of middle-class families.
- American families are suffering under Biden's failed economic agenda of higher taxes, soaring inflation, shrinking savings, and falling real wages.
 Luckily with a new Republican majority in the House and strong state
 Republican leadership, Biden and Democrats will be held accountable for their out-of-control spending.

GAVIN NEWSOM'S PROPOSED BUDGET

- This week, Governor Newsom presented his \$297 billion state budget proposal, and we are left with more questions than answers.
- Last year, California had a \$97 billion surplus, the highest surplus in not only the state's history, but the highest surplus on record for any state.
- While Republicans pushed for the Governor and the Legislature to put more in the rainy day fund, Capitol Dems spent a majority of the money to fund MORE social programs and pork projects, instead of saving for when we need it.
- We were all warned that a deficit was coming and it's finally here. We are facing a \$22 billion deficit this year.
- Most leaders would take the massive deficit as a sign that we should tighten the purse strings and commit to smarter spending. Not Newsom.
- Despite a massive deficit, the Governor is choosing just to delay some of his spending, instead of making the difficult choice to actually govern and make needed cuts.
- Governor Newsom and Capitol Dems need to acknowledge the situation, rein in their spending, and start reprioritizing funding to the real problems facing Californians.
- We need to focus on what matters most:
 - Affordability
 - Combatting homelessness
 - Public Safety
 - Quality Education
 - Water Infrastructure

- Fire Prevention
- California's government spending has only ramped up under Democrat leadership. Despite the state's population only growing 5% since the last census, spending has increased 152% under the past two Governors, with little to show for it in terms of helping improve the cost and quality of living for Californians.
- The Governor chose to only highlight top lines for flashy news sound bites, when the reality that he is calling for:
 - \$500 MILLION SMALL BUSINESS TAX HIKE: The governor is bending over backwards to protect the wasteful programs he's created over the years but breaking his promise to California job creators by cancelling Small Business Unemployment Insurance Tax Relief program. That will mean a \$500 million tax hike on small businesses, which were among the hardest hit during COVID.
 - MORE HOMELESSNESS SPENDING WITH NO PLAN FOR OVERSIGHT: There is more money thrown into homelessness programs. While the governor is touting that "accountability is required" now, he does nothing to elaborate on his plan for how exactly he plans to execute this. The state has already spent over \$17 billion on homelessness programs, as the problem continues to get worse.
 - NOT ENOUGH WILDFIRE PREVENTION MONEY: There is not nearly enough wildfire prevention money set aside, and Cal Fire is not using what they already have in the bank. Last year, Capitol Democrats put \$600 million in the budget for wildfire prevention, but this is not nearly enough to protect communities from devastating wildfires.
 - NO WATER STORAGE MONEY: There is no new money to build water storage this year. We are entering the fourth year of a drought and despite recent rains, there is no end in sight. There is no money this year to build Sites Reservoir or any money for replenishing existing water basins. Without new water storage, we can expect to have more water restrictions in the future.

Democrats control all of state government in California, leaving Republicans with little influence on policy and budget decisions. State Sen. Roger Niello, the top Republican on the state Senate's budget-writing committee, said lawmakers need

to focus on areas where the state is already spending lots of money with few results — like homelessness.

"Generally speaking, we wouldn't suggest necessarily that we spend more but spend smarter," Niello said.

Sac Bee, Stephen Hobbs, <u>California Republicans renew call for quicker</u> movement on water storage projects

Republicans in California's Assembly used a break in the storms Thursday to condemn Democrats for the drought-stricken state's inability to capture more of the rainfall that has inundated it in recent weeks.

"It's a failure of leadership," Assemblyman James Gallagher, R-Nicolaus, said during a press conference near the American River in Sacramento. "The Democratic supermajority and the governor have failed to make investments in water infrastructure."

Gallagher, the Republican Leader, was joined by 10 of his Assembly colleagues on a rare sunny day so far in 2023. They pleaded with Gov. Gavin Newsom to expedite pending water storage projects.


